About the School

Founded in 1952, the Adler School provides a range of innovative graduate programs at its campuses in Chicago, IL, Vancouver, BC, and through Adler Online. The Adler School continues the pioneering work of the first community psychologist, Alfred Adler, by graduating socially responsible practitioners, by engaging communities, and by advancing social justice.

The Adler School's doctoral and masters programs educate practitioners in applications of psychology, criminal justice, public policy and related fields informed by the School's social justice perspective. The School also houses an Institute on Social Exclusion, Institute on Public Safety and Social Justice, the LGBTQ Mental Health and Inclusion Center, and the Adler Child Guidance Center. Position Summary

The Adler School of Professional Psychology is seeking a dynamic, self-motivated educator to serve as Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs for Learning, Teaching and Educational Technology (AVP). Reporting directly to the Vice President of Academic Affairs, the AVP will provide leadership and strategic direction that will transform educational delivery at the Adler School. The AVP will be a key leader in taking the Adler School to the next level of programming, including advances in online education by focusing on quality, growth, and innovation. The AVP will be dedicated to fostering innovation to continue to improve learning effectiveness and student success, in the on-campus, online, and blended settings. This position will also provide leadership and strategic direction to the enhancement of learning and teaching through the integration of technology and other learning tools for members of the Adler School learning community.

The Adler School began providing online education options in 2007. Since then, the School's unique online offerings have attracted a robustly growing share of the School's new student enrollment, which has increased by 68% since 2007. In 2010, the Sloan Consortium recognized the Department of Online Learning with an Effective Practice Award for best practice in innovating faculty and student support systems. The School's strategic plan calls for significant growth of current degree offerings and the development of a vibrant system of online graduate degree programs--designed for current and emerging adult student markets, and distinctively addressing their education needs through dynamic content, technology and support.

- Develop and recommend policies and standards to the Vice President of Academic Affairs to assure innovation, retention, quality, and continuous improvement for all degree programs, including online and blended degree programs, at the Adler School.
- Collaborate with marketing and admissions teams to enhance the recruitment of high quality students for non-traditional degree programs.
- Identify, evaluate, and recommend cutting edge technology and industry standards related to learning.
- Oversee the preparation and oversight of the annual budget for the Department of Online Learning and the Center for Learning and Teaching.
- Develop and maintain knowledge of current and established trends to be reflected in course/program content and all aspects of distance education.
