Overview:

The successful candidate with have knowledge of and experience with the business and philanthropic community across Chicago.

Reporting directly to the President, the Vice President of Institutional Advancement will be a member of the President's Cabinet and will have broad strategic and management responsibility for conceiving and implementing both long and short term advancement plans including fundraising, Board development, alumni relations, and, in conjunction with the Vice President of Marketing and Communications, associated public relations and marketing. The Vice President will serve as the chief advisor to the President and Board of Trustees on all matters related to institutional advancement, cultivating and leading the efforts to provide key leaders with significant opportunities to present their programs to major donors, corporations, foundations and community groups. The Vice President will be a highly visible representative of the University to a wide array of internal and external audiences.

Qualifications of the successful candidate include:

- Broad experience as a development professional with superior communication and interpersonal skills, who can passionately and articulately espouse the mission of and case for support of National Louis University, and thrives working with a dynamic and engaged leadership team.
- A history of success in both solicitation of major gifts and cultivation of donors (on behalf of the President and governing body) will be required, as well as a demonstrated ability to plan and execute follow-through on fundraising plans.
- Supervisory skills and the ability to lead and organize people.
- The ability to utilize appropriate consultation and fact-gathering in support of decision making.
- The ability to work well with diverse groups, including donors, volunteers, Trustees and others
- Experience making effective and persuasive presentations.
- Sound administrative experience with strategic planning, goal setting, budgeting and fiscal reporting procedures.
- A bachelor's degree is required. A graduate degree is preferred.
