THE INSTITUTION

South Dakota State University (SDSU) is the state's largest, most comprehensive university. As South Dakota's Morrill Act land-grant university, SDSU had a fall 2014 enrollment of 12,557 students from all 50 states and 79 countries. Approximately 67 percent of SDSU students are residents of South Dakota, 29 percent are from other states and 4 percent from other countries. The University provides a rich academic experience in an environment of inclusion and access through inspired, student-centered education, creative activities and research, innovation and engagement.

The American Association of University Professors categorizes SDSU as a Category 1 or doctorallevel institution. The University is designated as research high in the Carnegie Classifications.

The University has been designated an Innovation and Economic Prosperity University by the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU) and its Commission on Innovation, Competitiveness, and Economic Prosperity is a major resource for the economic development needs of the state.

Over the last five years, university research has yielded 245 inventions disclosed, 65 patents filed, 9 patents issued, and 35 license agreements executed through the Office of Technology Transfer and Commercialization, resulting in more than \$10 million in license revenue. THE DIVISION OF MANAGEMENT AND ECONOMICS

The position is in the Economics Department, a participating department in the newly formed intercollegiate Division of Management and Economics. The Division of Management and Economics serves as a cross-college, interdisciplinary entity comprising faculty from academic programs that share a commitment to education and research in management, economics, and data analytics. The division will provide a forum and structure to foster communication, innovation, and efficiencies across programs, departments, and colleges. The Division will foster collaboration between the business and academic communities and will coordinate and advance efforts in curriculum, student engagement, faculty interaction, interdisciplinary research, and external outreach.

The department plays a central role in SDSU's economics and management programs, which strive to strengthen and harmonize management education across the university. SDSU is a member of AACSB and in the preliminary stages of seeking accreditation.

Innovation Partners and the Enterprise Institute located at the SDSU Research Park Innovation Center provide opportunities for networking with regional innovators and entrepreneurs, and also provide opportunities for part-time employment and incubator space for students. SDSU has a strong investor and alumni network that is actively engaged in the classroom and in student-ventures competitions including the First Dakota National Bank Business Plan Competition, the Veenis Entrepreneurial Experience, and the Rickert Visiting Entrepreneurship Speaker Series. The CEO (Collegiate Entrepreneurs Organization) club is very active and students in the degree program and the CEO club compete in regional business plan and innovation/idea competitions and have used awards to finance their start-up enterprises.

THE OPPORTUNITY

The Department of Economics at South Dakota State University invites applications for an associate or full professor who will hold the inaugural Milton Nies Endowed Chair in Entrepreneurship. Program support and summer stipend for the chair will be supported by the \$2 million Milton Nies endowment. The department seeks a scholar with a strong record of nationally recognized research in the areas of entrepreneurship, innovation, or venture finance, and who demonstrates excellence in teaching, collaborates across disciplines, and mentors student entrepreneurs. This position is a full-time, 9-month, academic appointment.

The Milton Nies Endowed Chair in Entrepreneurship will produce high-quality research, work with faculty, students, and staff across the university to develop an outreach program, engage entrepreneurs, economic-development professionals, and other critical local, regional, and statewide stakeholders, and teach undergraduate and graduate courses in subject areas that may include venture finance and management, creativity, new venture creation, or operations.

The Department of Economics includes 30 faculty members who hold academic, research, and extension appointments in a broad range of economics specializations. The Department offers an undergraduate major and minor in entrepreneurial studies, in addition to undergraduate majors in economics, agricultural business, and agricultural and resources economics, a specialization in business economics, and a master's degree in economics. Roughly 750 students belong to the Department of Economics, 135 of these students major in Entrepreneurial Studies, which is a fast-growing major. Graduates of the department hold key leadership and management positions across the northern Great Plains and Midwest in banking, investment and venture capital firms, processing and manufacturing, energy and bioenergy, and food and agribusiness management, and are leaders in the innovation and entrepreneurship community.

Experience teaching effectual entrepreneurship is desired as well.
