THE OPPORTUNITY

The **Director of Project Management, Planning & Design** reports to the Senior Director of Facilities & Asset Management. The Director is responsible for direct comprehensive management of the project management team, deferred maintenance and contracted management programs including maintaining process and fiscal control of projects. The position is responsible for approximately 13 technical and administrative staff and an annual operating budget of \$2.5M to \$3M. The Project Management, Planning & Design team provides planning, design and construction services to all Portland Public School (PPS) facilities.

Essential Duties/Responsibilities:

- Budget Development Develops annual budgets for renovation and deferred maintenance. Assists in the preparation of departmental operational and capital improvement budgets. Develops conceptual plans and budgets for facilities projects to support fiscal decision making.
- 2. **Construction Contract Procurement** Responsible for the execution and oversight of a professional construction procurement process in compliance with Oregon Statutes, related Board policy and other applicable regulations.
- 3. Capital Project Development and Management Directs the comprehensive management of the deferred capital maintenance program including programming, developing and collecting requirements; prioritizing construction, renewal and maintenance and repair activities.

- 4. **Contract Administration**--Responsible for execution and administration of all architecture, engineering and construction contracts.
- 5. **Energy Conservation Program** Responsible for the development and implementation of the energy conservation program for the entire department.
- 6. **Project Communications** Assists and advises the Director on issues with various state and municipal planning boards, commissions, "code enforcers," neighborhood/community associations, consortiums and district neighborhoods.
- 7. **Project Execution** Prepares contract change orders and monitors their execution. Receives pay requests from professional consultants and contractors and approves for payment. Monitors and facilitates resolution of construction contract disputes and claims. Monitors construction contract close-out and maintains documentation files.
- 8. **Project Planning** Develops planning documents for initiation of projects to gain approval at Board level. Coordinates all parties involved in the planning, design and construction process. Reviews contract plans and specifications for compliance with appropriate building codes, district standards and project requirements. Prepares requests for proposal and conducts all necessary meetings to facilitate hiring architectural and construction management services. Assists in development of new standards of practice for project management activities.
- 9. **Performance Improvement** Facilitates the division management teams development, implementation, evaluation and reporting on:
 - Procedures to improve efficiency and reduce costs
 - Staff training and performance
 - A team management system for the department

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in architecture, engineering, construction or project management or related field; Master's preferred. A degree in an unrelated field could be substituted provided the candidate has had substantial related experience in a similar public or private campus-like organization.
- Five years of public industry experience in planning, architecture, project management, or construction management; three years minimum of management experience being accountable and responsible for the management of professional, technical and administrative staff.
- Knowledge of:
 - o Facilities planning and construction management processes and procedures.
 - o Estimating, budgeting and scheduling practices.
 - o Current status of costs of new construction, escalation factors and market trends.
 - o Building codes and standards of practice.
 - o Laws governing construction contracts and contracting.
 - o Construction materials and methods.
- Skill in reading and interpreting plans and specifications and to compare them with construction progress.

Both snowcapped peaks are just a short drive from the city. Stretching above 11,000 feet, Mount Hood is Oregon's highest point. It's a downhill and crosscountry skiers' paradise and summer training home for the US Olympic ski team with its yearround snow. During the spring and summer, campers pitch their tents on glassy mountain lakes along the Pacific Crest Trail.

If it's ocean you're looking for, the Oregon Coast is a year-round playground for adventure-seekers and beachcombers alike. Along the scenic coast Highway 101 you'll find quaint beach towns and wind-wracked headlands hundreds of feet above the crashing Pacific, and miles of unpeopled beach, all of which is accessible to the public by law. Wild flowers grow atop massive cliffs, and eons of wind and angry waves have carved giant boulders into caves and lovely cathedralesque hollows. Bring your wetsuit and surf or sea kayak among the sea lions instead of the crowds.
