This mission leads Woods College to develop a best in class online/hybrid Masters in Health Administration program. This program will offer a competency based educational model to non-residential and adult students and professionals.

THE OPPORTUNITY

The Program Director, working in conjunction with the Dean and Associate Dean of Academic Affairs, will provide leadership for the development, implementation, launch, and ongoing management of the hybrid/online Masters of Health Administration (MHA) program at the Woods College of Advancing Studies.

The Program Director may also participate in teaching for the program. Major areas of responsibility include:

• Development of program value proposition and market-responsive program features that enhance differentiation and competitiveness;

- Guidance of MHA program development and implementation (e.g., program and curriculum design, faculty recruitment and hire, integration of program with academic and core business processes at Boston College, management of program accreditation, marketing, and student recruitment and retention);
- Management of vendors that support the program;
- Development of internal and external advisory relationships and partnerships (e.g., deans of other academic units at BC; external employers); and
- Ongoing program management (e.g., ongoing curriculum development and assessment, enrollment management, oversight of student lifecycle services, and tracking, assessing, and reporting on student progress and the program's outcomes).

The Program Director reports to the Dean of Woods College of Advancing Studies. He/she will hold supervisory responsibility over a Program Manager, Admissions Processor, Online Operations Manager, and, one to three Program Faculty FTEs by the time the program is running at full scale.

The initial challenges for this position will be to plan and implement all facets of an academically strong Master of Health Administration (MHA) program in an online, competency-based format with appeal to a variety of audiences, potentially including executives and mid-career professionals. This program is a critical part of the WCAS strategic plan for growth and represents an opportunity to develop a model for other programs at the college. Ongoing challenges and/or problems include increasing the program's enrollment and retaining students in a competitive market.

By year five of the program, it is anticipated that the Program Director will oversee more than \$1 million in net return annually, and supervise between five and ten FTEs between faculty and staff.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Master's degree required; Ph.D. strongly preferred.
- The ideal candidate will have a terminal degree in an appropriate discipline relative to health administration (e.g., Ph.D., M.D.) with experience in teaching, advising, and graduate program development and oversight.
- The ideal candidate will possess at least five (5) years of industry experience in positions related to health administration, with increasing breadth and level of management responsibility.
- Experience in academic program development, teaching required; administrative experience preferred.
- Online education experience preferred; desire required.
- Strong communication, collaboration, and consensus-building skills.
- Involvement with relevant professional, government, and/or industry associations and agencies, and a record of developing strategic partnerships with critical external organizations.
- Ability to tactfully and effectively respond to and handle a broad range of high level and sensitive interpersonal situations, conflicts, and problems involving diverse personalities.

- Demonstrable problem solving skills and ability to work independently.
- Experience as an effective team leader.




BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTES
