The **Director of Residence Life** responsibilities include but may not be limited to:

Residence Life

The Director will be responsible for the educational leadership and overall operation of campus residence halls. He/she will provide leadership, direction, budget management, and supervision to develop a positive living and learning environment that is conducive to personal growth, academic learning, and comfortable living. The successful candidate will have a philosophical commitment to educating in the residential classroom and will strive to provide outstanding learning experiences for students.

- Provide leadership and supervision of all aspects of a residence life program for approximately 1,400 students and 7 residence halls
- Design, create, and execute a strategic plan for the department including facility long-term planning, residential education initiatives/curriculum, staff development, and assessment initiatives to improve the quality of life in the residence halls and meet the strategic initiatives/mission of the institution
- Supervise and provide responsible oversight to residence life and revenue bond budgets
- Train, hire, mentor and supervise 5 full-time professional staff members
- Oversee and provide recommendations for facility improvements to the residence halls
- Work collaborative with faculty, staff, and students across campus to develop and support student progress and retention initiatives
- Create and manage emergency protocol response for residence hall staff and provide on-call support as needed
- Design, create, and execute the learning outcomes for both a residential programming curriculum and staff training/development
- Oversee contracts and put together RFP's for large scale purchases with outside vendors
- Initiate, coordinate and promote residential programming experiences including RHA, living-learning communities, and special interest housing
- Review, approve, and enforce all residence life policies, regulations, contracts, and procedures
- Recruit, organize, and execute summer conferencing program

Judicial Affairs

The Director will coordinate enforcement of the College conduct code, ensuring compliance with community standards, campus policies, and state and federal law. He/she will provide due process, administrative management and response coordination for student behavior on and off campus. The Director will train, advise, and educate students, faculty, administrators and the larger college community with regard to judicial procedures, student rights and responsibilities and community standards. The successful candidate will infuse an educational approach to the judicial model to ensure all participants will learn from the process.

- Adjudicate serious cases referred for disciplinary action
- Train judicial officers and student judicial board members
- Coordinate judicial hearings
- Review the outcomes of judicial hearings; implement sanctions; consult with students and others regarding judicial matters, as appropriate
- Maintain judicial records
- Ensure the integrity of the judicial process and recommend changes in policies and procedures when indicated
- Collaborate with college departments to resolve problematic student behavior in ways that manage risk and bring resolution, with or without judicial action
- Collaborate with internal and external agencies and resources to develop and implement prevention programs to address students' high risk behaviors, particularly as they relate to alcohol, drug, and relationship abuse programs

Student Services Programs and Services

The Director will assist with the development, implementation, and oversight of the programs and services of the office of Student Services, to include crisis response, problem resolution, student advocacy, critical issues programming, parent relations, and community relations.
