THE ORGANIZATION

The **W.K. Kellogg Foundation (WKKF)**, founded in 1930 as an independent, private foundation by breakfast cereal pioneer Will Keith Kellogg, is among the largest philanthropic foundations in the United States. Guided by the belief that all children should have an equal opportunity to thrive, WKKF works with communities to create conditions for vulnerable children so they can realize their full potential in school, work and life.

The Kellogg Foundation is based in Battle Creek, Michigan, and works throughout the United States and internationally, as well as with sovereign tribes. Special emphasis is paid to certain locations where there are high concentrations of poverty and where children face significant barriers to success. WKKF priority locations in the U.S. are located in Michigan, Mississippi, New Mexico and New Orleans. The foundation has been active internationally – in various ways, in numerous countries on four continents – virtually since its creation in 1930. THE POSITION

The **Information Technology Manager** reports to the Vice President for Information Systems & Technology. He/she will provide day-to-day oversight for the information technology function, including the management of external service providers (outsourced infrastructure services), their onsite staff, and several internal WKKF employees. The Manager will also provide leadership in personnel supervision, budgeting, project management and oversight, and end-user training and enablement activities. He/she is expected to actively promote a high level of customer service and continuous improvement opportunities for all technical systems and services.

Specifically, the IT Manager will:

- Manage technical infrastructure managed services/cloud computing providers to ensure services fulfill contractual and service level agreements and meet organizational needs.
- Assess the need for and manage key vendor relationships and negotiate contracts. Manage contractors and external resources.
- Ensure the safety and stability of WKKF systems through ensuring appropriate documentation, disaster response/business continuity planning and implementation of

appropriate security measures. Represent the technology function as a member of the Enterprise Risk Management Team.

- Directly manage or oversee user empowerment strategies, including technical orientation, and formal and informal training and outreach efforts for staff. Partner with Talent and Human Resources in the design, development, implementation and ongoing monitoring of all technical training.
- Manage or co-manage department staff including delegation and prioritization of workloads and enforcing appropriate levels of accountability.
- Manage department budget, contracting and purchasing functions, ensuring cost-effective use of resources and alignment with organizational goals, policies and procedures.
- Actively pursue a high-level of customer service and continuous quality improvement of all technical systems and services.
- Directly manage or oversee numerous system and tool development efforts including financial and human resources, client and vendor relationships and project outcomes. Act as project manager on select projects.
- Oversee the development, implementation, ongoing enhancement and content management of WKKF's content management and collaboration platform(s) (SharePoint and JIVE), including intranet and extranet environments.
- Actively pursue integration across systems, department team members, vendors, partners and projects.
- Actively pursue integration of the Information Systems and Technology team with other WKKF teams.
- Support the Vice President for Information Systems and Technology in strategic and long-term planning efforts.
- Stay abreast of technological changes and innovations in the technology industry.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

The requirements for the IT Manager include:

- Bachelor's degree in computer science/IT, business or related field is required. Master's degree is preferred.
- 5 to 7 years of experience in technology management with at least 3 to 5 years of management experience.
- Experience managing technical infrastructure/managed service providers is preferred.
- Experience working effectively with persons from diverse cultural, social and ethnic backgrounds.
- Highly developed project management skills preferred.
