THE OPPORTUNITY

The Assistant Dean of Student Life/Director of Student Conduct (ADSL/DSC) reports to the Associate Vice President for Student Affairs/Dean of Student Life, as part of the Office of the Dean of Student Life, a division of Enrollment Management and Student Affairs. The Office of the Dean of Student Life promotes student development and leadership, enhances student success, and facilitates an optimally respectful, diverse inclusive campus environment. The Assistant Dean serves as leader and collaborator with colleagues on matters that shape the positive learning environment and campus culture and has the opportunity to profoundly impact student life at a dynamic and thriving institution. The Assistant Dean's duties include a wide range of administrative and programmatic initiatives to further the work of the Office of the Dean of Student Life. Toward this end, the Assistant Dean works directly with those within the Office of the Dean of Student Life and also with campus partners, including Housing and Residence Life, Athletics, Campus Public Safety Office, and the Office of Equity and Compliance.

The Assistant Dean plays an integral role in promoting a campus environment that supports the overall educational mission of the University and protects the University community from disruption and harm, encourages appropriate standards for behavior, and fosters ethical standards of engaged citizens. He/she serves as the Senior Conduct Officer for student conduct cases. Specific responsibilities include:

- Coordinating the campus response to alleged violations of the Student Code of Conduct in order to maintain a campus environment congruent with the university priorities of maintaining a safe and harassment free campus climate, supporting student success, and maintaining fairness in the classroom;
- Supporting all Student Affairs' responses to student issues, concerns, and emergencies;
- Developing appropriate policies and procedures which apply to the programs of responsibility;

- Serving on appropriate committees; interacting directly with campus security and other law enforcement agencies;
- Working cooperatively with other University departments to create co- curricular and experiential learning experiences for students; developing and supporting plans to create a more open, diverse campus environment;
- Engaging in budget monitoring for supervised units;
- Contributing to stewardship of positive and educationally purposeful campus climate; and
- Contributing to assessment and evaluation of programs within the Office of the Dean of Student Life and Enrollment Management and Student Affairs.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Master's degree in College Student Personnel Administration or a related field.
- Three years of full-time professional experience in conduct processes, conflict resolution, or dispute resolution.
- Knowledge of Title IX, the Clery Act, and the Campus SaVE Act.
- Ability to relate well to faculty, staff and students and to effectively articulate the institution's mission and priorities, as well as a proven track record in bridging academic and student affairs with the implementation of new initiatives and programs.
- Demonstrated ability to interpret federal, state, and local laws along with appropriate University Policies.
- Demonstrated strong organizational, planning, analytic, problem solving, interpersonal skills, as well as excellent written and verbal skills.
- Demonstrated ability to maintain strict confidentiality.

Recommended Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience on an urban campus.
- Seven years of successful and progressively responsible experience in higher education.
- Three years' experience conducting Title IX investigations, including assisting with interim measures.
- Professional experience or equivalent in higher education on a campus with residence halls.
- Completed certification for Title IX Coordinators.
- Completion of trauma informed investigation training.

Portland, Oregon

Whether you see Portland, Oregon, as a small town with a big-city feel or a big city that feels like a small town, it is a cool place to live. Located on the banks of the Willamette River only 90 minutes from snow-capped peaks and the Pacific Ocean, you might not realize Portland's bustling downtown and waterfront are the heart of a metropolitan region with more than 2 million people. Twelve bridges span a wide elbow of the Willamette River, connecting the east and west sides of town. Throughout the metro area are thriving neighborhoods filled with restaurants, record shops, bars, funky clothing stores, antique malls and art galleries. Portland also has an abundance of movie theaters (some even serve beer and pizza), new and used bookstores (including Powell's, the largest bookstore west of the Mississippi), coffee shops and clubs.

Within walking distance of the PSU campus is the world-class Portland Art Museum, the Oregon Historical Society, a performing arts complex and a concert hall. For the sports-minded, the Portland area has its own NBA team (the Trail Blazers) and a major league soccer team (the Timbers) as well as minor-league baseball and hockey teams. Outdoorsy types love Forest Parks, the largest city park in the nation, with 5,000 acres of hiking and biking trails, a zoo, public gardens and beautiful old-growth woods. And all of this is connected by one of the world's leading public transportation systems, a combination of buses, streetcars, and light-rail trains, making the entire metro area only a couple stops away.

If you like day trips, a short drive in any direction will lead you to some of the most breathtaking scenery in the world: mountains, seashore, river gorge and desert.

Both snowcapped peaks are just a short drive from the city. Stretching above 11,000 feet, Mount Hood is Oregon's highest point. It's a downhill and crosscountry skiers' paradise and summer training home for the US Olympic ski team with its yearround snow. During the spring and summer, campers pitch their tents on glassy mountain lakes along the Pacific Crest Trail.

If it's ocean you're looking for, the Oregon Coast is a year-round playground for adventure-seekers and beachcombers alike. Along the scenic coast Highway 101 you'll find quaint beach towns and wind-wracked headlands hundreds of feet above the crashing Pacific, and miles of unpeopled beach, all of which is accessible to the public by law. Wild flowers grow atop massive cliffs, and eons of wind and angry waves have carved giant boulders into caves and lovely cathedralesque hollows. Bring your wetsuit and surf or sea kayak among the sea lions instead of the crowds.
