THE OPPORTUNITY

Overview:

Cincinnati State is presently seeking an experienced academic administrative leader for the Dean of Health and Public Safety position. This position serves as the senior academic officer for the Health & Public Safety Division and is responsible for the overall management and leadership of that division. The position reports to the Academic Vice President.

Founded in 1966, Cincinnati State Technical and Community College (Cincinnati State) is widely recognized for its Cooperative Education Program (CEP), providing students with ‘real world’ learning experiences in partnership with 800-plus firms representing every industry in the region. The CEP is one of the largest programs of its kind in the U.S. among community colleges.

Cincinnati State continues to expand both credit and non-credit programs and has scheduled the opening of a new campus this fall in Middletown, OH. The College was also recently awarded “Lead Partner” status by the Department of Labor to manage a 19.6 million dollar grant to design and develop health workforce training programs in collaboration with nine other community colleges.

The college offers more than 100 associate degree programs, majors and certificate programs in the following academic divisions: Business Technologies, Center for Innovative Technologies, Health and Public Safety, Humanities and Sciences. Annually, more than 20,000 students enroll in Cincinnati State courses that are offered in the day, evening, and on weekends. International students attending Cincinnati State represent more than 75 countries. In addition to its academic and technical programs, the college offers many continuing education opportunities through short courses, seminars, and on-site training for area businesses and industries. The college is fully accredited by The Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association for Colleges and Schools and also holds numerous programmatic accreditations.

Cincinnati State Technical and Community College provides student-focused, accessible, quality technical and general education, academic transfer, experiential and cooperative education, and workforce development.

The Position:

The Dean of Health and Public Safety provides for and assures the integrity of all degree and certificate programs, course offerings, and cooperative education/experiential learning within the division. The Dean administers the selection, supervision, and evaluation of divisional faculty and staff, instructional fiscal planning, and community and industry relationships, and ensures the development and expansion of high quality academic programs designed to address community needs and provide stackable credentials and degrees that provide seamless articulation with all secondary and postsecondary partners. The position manages associate deans, program chairs, full-time and adjunct instructors, grant managers, other contractual and non-contractual personnel.

Note: While the college would be pleased to have identified the candidate-of-choice in time to begin the 2012 fall academic semester, a later fall or January start date may be acceptable.

Specific responsibilities include:

- Develop and implement a strategic plan for the division, including plans for achievement and maintenance of appropriate professional accreditation for programs, progressive use of technology for course delivery, and transfer assurance.
- Provide divisional leadership in instruction, curriculum and program development, clinical education, and cooperative education responsive to community/industry needs.
- Systematically evaluate and review divisional programs, curricula and courses. Use analysis of data to formulate recommendations regarding new or existing programs. Achieve satisfactory enrollments in all courses and programs.
- Actively seek grant opportunities and work with offices of Institutional Research and Grants Administration to collect and analyze meaningful data to respond to grant proposals and to inform division strategic initiatives.
- Promote a culture of mutual trust, respect, fairness, and integrity throughout the division.
- Lead growth in programs and enrollment, especially On-Line courses, degrees, and certificates e.g. new Health Information Technology program.
- Continue to support and build on College's reputation for high professional standards for teaching excellence through valuing 'best practices' and maximizing learning technologies across the curriculum.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in health sciences field or public safety field.
- Master's degree required.
- Doctorate degree highly preferred.
- Minimum of five years of experience in higher education, including administrative and teaching experience.
- Administrative experience managing budgets, directing personnel with varied duties, and familiarity with mission and function of a comprehensive community college.
- Experience working with collective bargaining agreements and managing grants.
- Cooperative education/experiential learning experience, quality management principles, industry partnerships, distance education, college and secondary articulation, and diversity of people and ideas.

The Cincinnati area is a vibrant and progressive three-state, 15-county region that offers world-class assets in arts and culture, amusements, hospitality, sports and recreation. Cincinnati features all the amenities of a large, bustling metropolis while maintaining a friendly, small town atmosphere.

Cincinnati Facts:

- **Location:** Cincinnati is set on the north bank of the Ohio River in a narrow, steep-sided valley on the Ohio-Kentucky border in southwestern Ohio.
- **Population:** As of the 2010 census, 296,945 people were reported to reside within the city limits with a population of 2,138,038 residing in the Cincinnati metropolitan area.
- **Interesting Facts:**
 - Cincinnati was founded in 1788.
 - Cincinnati is known for its large collection of historic architecture. Over-the-Rhine, a neighborhood just to the north of Downtown Cincinnati, boasts among the world's largest collections of Italianate architecture, rivaling similar neighborhoods in New York City, Vienna and Munich in size and scope. Constructed mainly between 1850 and 1900, Over-the-Rhine was the center of life for German immigrants for many years, and is one of the largest historic districts listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
 - Cincinnati is home to two major sports teams, the Cincinnati Reds and the Cincinnati Bengals.
