An accredited nonprofit institution by Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), Pacific Oaks College offers bachelor's degree completion, master's, and certificate programs in early childhood education, human development, counseling, and teaching credentialing. The Position:

The **Dean of Academic Affairs** is responsible for leading and supporting the faculty and academic staff of the Pasadena Campus and all academic sites in the delivery of instruction that meets Pacific Oaks College's goals for academic excellence in tandem with the dynamic and diverse goals of the campus. The Dean is also responsible to contribute to the development of sound academic policies and processes that support the collaborative academic goals of Pacific Oaks Academic Affairs.

This position reports to the President, Pacific Oaks.

Essential Functions:

- Lead the strategic academic planning process for the campus by working with operations, Directors of Schools, faculty, major committees and governance groups to assure the delivery of high quality, effective academic programs that meet the campus' fiscal, operational, and quality goals.
- Assure the academic quality, integrity, and continuous improvement of campus curricular content and instructional delivery through POC's' program review processes and to assess and improve faulty performance.
- Build and maintain a climate of academic excellence, professional integrity, and intellectual rigor both inside and outside of the classroom.
- Encourage and reward the development of innovative new programming.
- Assure that academic programming and processes meet the minimum standardized structures and content establish by POC.
- Provide leadership to department chairs and faculty to fulfill campus and institutional advancement and sponsored program goals.
- Ensure program and institutional compliance with criteria for professional accreditation and state certification.
- Oversee the preparation of sound annual budgets for the academic schools and departments and assure compliance with these budgets. Allocate academic resources to best support the academic goals of the campus.
- Recruit and retain diverse and qualified faculty and staff.
- Implement faculty governance structures and establish regular communications with the leadership of Faculty Senate.
- Maintain connectivity with local and regional colleges and universities, as well as with the WASC and other professional organizations, for recruitment and relevant collaborative efforts.
- Develop and recommend major academic, student, and faculty policies to the President to assure innovation, quality, continuous improvement, and growth of POC.
- Work collaboratively with the Office of Admissions to assure the recruitment, retention, and graduation of a diverse student body.
- Support and participate in the Academic Affairs Committee of the Board of Trustees.
- Performs related work as assigned.

- Senior level experience in higher education administration with a strong record of academic leadership.
- A commitment to assessment and continuous improvement.
- A commitment to furthering the mission of POC campus and academic sites through growth with quality.

- Demonstrated record of advancing faculty and student diversity in higher education.
- Very strong interpersonal and relationship building skills.
- Evidence of successful decision making in a collaborative environment.
- Experience in a fast-paced, matrix organization where various parts of the organization are collectively responsible for the success of the program; ability to drive progress and hold individuals accountable for their contributions to various projects and initiatives.

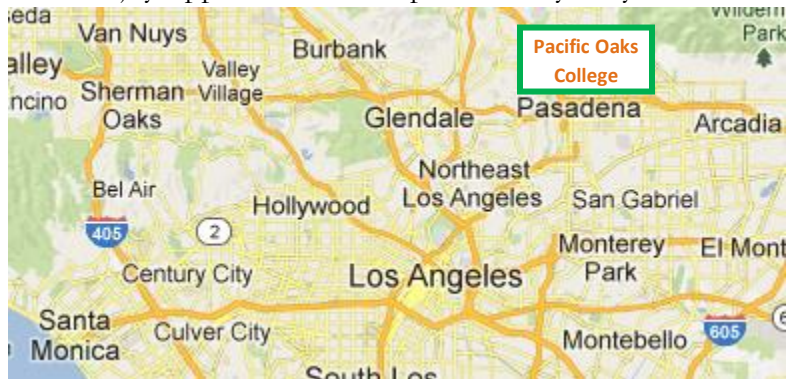


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PASADENA, CALIFORNIA

Pasadena, California is nestled in the breathtaking San Gabriel Valley and gives its residents access to cultural and academic riches. The word Pasadena literally means "valley" in the Ojibwa (Chippewa) Indian language. Old Pasadena is famous for its blocks of bustling boutiques, quaint cafes, bookshops, fine dining, a plethora of entertainment and recreational attractions as well as its famed Rose Bowl. Nature enthusiasts will enjoy opportunities to explore nearby canyons and the foothills of the San Gabriel Mountains. Downtown Pasadena offers world-class museums, art galleries, theater, and shopping. It is home to an educational community with such renowned institutions as Caltech, Le Cordon Bleu College of Culinary Arts, and the Art Center College of Design.



Within easy driving distance, beaches offer endless opportunities for sunning, surfing and people-watching while Los Angeles introduces visitors to the glitter of Hollywood, the glamour of Beverly Hills, and daily itineraries that include world-famous amusement parks, high-end window shopping, and vibrant nightlife. LA is also home to hundreds of schools, clinics and nonprofit organizations.

Interesting facts about Pasadena, CA:

- Pasadena has 23 parks, totaling more than one thousand acres of parkland. About 60,000 trees line the streets of Pasadena.
- The rose (no particular variety) was adopted as Pasadena's official flower on September 22, 1961.
- Naturalized parrots are frequently seen and heard around Pasadena. One common breed is the Red-crowned parrot.
- About 1,000,000 people come to Pasadena to watch the Tournament of Roses. The Tournament of Roses annual parade of flower covered floats has been held in Pasadena since January 1, 1890.
- During the winter months of December through March, it is sunny or partly sunny 75% of the time. It has snowed twice in the city's history.
