The Position:

Reporting to the President of TCSPP, the Campus President is the chief administrative and academic officer of the campus and a member of the National President's Cabinet. The Campus President is responsible for providing leadership to ensure the vibrancy of the campus. Academic and administrative excellence, program growth, fiscal leadership, and institutional advancement are top priorities. The Campus President oversees campus efforts in the areas of admission, strategic planning, allocation and management of resources, faculty relations, student and employee alliance-building, community and public relations, accreditation and compliance, and productivity measurement and improvement. The Campus President is expected to be a strong communicator and collaborative leader on campus, within the school, with all constituents, and in the community.

Principle Duties:

- In collaboration with the national leadership team and within the strategic plan, develop and promote long- and short-range goals for the campus. Be the voice of the Chicago campus at the national leadership table.
- In collaboration with the Chief Academic Officer, ensure a culture of excellence in educational programs, teaching, research, and scholarship.
- In collaboration with the Chief Finance Officer, ensure excellence and effectiveness in resource allocation and administration.

- Develop and nurture relationships with regulatory oversight agencies. Lead the campus activities in preparing for self-studies, focus visits and comprehensive accreditation reviews.
- Build and grow student enrollment and actively enhance retention and graduation.
- Plan and administer the campus annual budget, manage the revenues of the operation, and control the expenses. Oversee and deliver desired campus financial results, ensuring the campus grows revenues and operating surplus according to approved budgets and long-range plans.
- Assess needs for resources on campus and ensure that required resources are planned, acquired, and properly implemented.
- Develop a strong team of campus administrators, faculty and staff. Responsibilities include hiring, mentoring, advising, directing, and evaluating.

- An earned doctorate from an accredited institution.
- Experience in higher education administration and leadership (dean, vice president, campus president) preferably from an environment in which graduate students have been educated for license-eligible professions.
- A history of strong faculty and staff relations. Understanding of matters of governance and their application in a multi-campus national and system education model.
- A track record of achievement in academic leadership, enrollment growth, marketing and admissions, and advancement.
- Demonstrated financial management, budgeting and planning skills.
- Demonstrated commitment to the student experience.

- Senior level experience in higher education administration with a strong record of administrative and academic leadership and a commitment to innovation and continuous improvement.
- Demonstrated leadership in accreditation processes.
