

THE OPPORTUNITY

Overview:

Warren Wilson College (WWC) has been evolving its institutional practice of environmental citizenship since 1894. The mission of Warren Wilson College is to provide a distinctive undergraduate and graduate liberal arts education. The educational program, the Triad, is singular in higher education and is tied to an overarching mission to educate for environmental responsibility. The Triad consists of three interwoven strands of experience:

- Academics in the liberal arts tradition
- Campus-wide 15 hour per week work program
- Community service learning (100 hour requirement for graduation)

The Triad is infused with a sustainability ethic and cross-cultural understanding-integral parts of the College's history and founding philosophy. Warren Wilson College seeks to lead the nation toward a new model for liberal arts education through the innovation of its Triad educational program, the quality of its academic engagement, the fulfillment of its sustainability principles, the depth of its commitment to diversity, the vitality of its community, and it's nurturing of individual well-being.

Just ten minutes outside of Asheville, NC, Warren Wilson is situated on a 300-acre working farm, 700-acre managed forest, and riverine habitat which serves as a living laboratory for sustainable practices. Led by faculty and staff, students learn in the classroom, in the forest and fields and in the wider community-locally and internationally. Academics, work, and service connect to create a holistic, experiential education.

Dr. Steven L. Solnick, New Delhi Representative for the Ford Foundation since 2008, was named by the Warren Wilson College Board of Trustees as the college's seventh president effective July 2012. He said, "I am honored and excited by the opportunity to lead Warren Wilson, a college that believes, as I do, that higher education should offer not an escape from the 'real world' but a set of tools for thriving in it. Location: Asheville, North Carolina

The Position:

The Director of Financial Aid coordinates, plans, and oversees the application and award processes of financial aid for undergraduate and graduate students; coordinates veterans' benefits; and supervises a staff consisting of a full-time Associate Director, one full-time Counselor/Aid Assistant and one student worker. The Director will report to the Vice President for Enrollment & Marketing.

Specific Responsibilities:

- Directs all financial aid functions with the purpose of enrolling and maintaining a diverse student body and institutional eligibility for continued participation in Federal and State aid programs.
- Creates and maintains a customer service based focus for the Office of Financial Aid and coordinates efforts with the College Business Office, Registrar, Administrative Computing Center, Admissions, MFA and International Programs as well as other offices on campus.
- Directs the administration of financial aid; ensures applicants receive assistance in the application process for loans, grants and scholarships. Makes awards to current and incoming students while adhering to Title IV regulations, state and federal guidelines, private non-profit agencies, institutional packaging policy and budget parameters.
- Oversees the administration of private, state, and/or federal loan programs; coordinates the awarding of need-based scholarships/grants and the renewal of merit-based awards.
- Provides estimates of a pre-award amount for Federal Work Study and Work College funds.
- Manages the veteran benefit program to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal regulations using VA ONCE to certify college enrollment.
- Directs the completion of reports to request funding, document expenditures or marketing. Reports include but are not limited to FISAP, IPEDS, WWC Fact Book, CFNC for NC funds, Pell, direct lending and marketing reports such as Peterson, FISKE and US News.
- Directs the human resources activities for the function including hiring, development, training, merit recommendations, promotions, transfers, and performance evaluations.
- Plans and directs the presentation and enforcement of policies and forms (i.e. Withdrawal and Refund, Satisfactory Academic Progress Standards, Verification forms, etc.).
- Participates in off-campus training when available and as needed. Attends the Department
 of Education's annual FAS Conference (fall), any NC state meeting (usually mandatory).
 Attends training and professional development meetings as needed to stay abreast of
 regulations and changes.
- Maintains contact with outside agencies such as Gates, Gilman, SIT and NCICU to finalize aid for participating students.
- Represents Warren Wilson College during audits: Federal Program Review, North Carolina State Approving Agency, North Carolina Higher Education Assistance Authority, Department of Veteran Affairs, and the annual external audit prepared for the United States Department of Education and the State of North Carolina.
- Works with the Vice-President of EM&M to review appeal cases, special circumstances, and college-wide financial aid policy.
- Serves on institutional committees as needed.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree plus three to five years (or more) experience in financial aid with an institution of higher education. Master's preferred.
- Knowledge of Title IV guidelines for administration of federal aid.
- Experience with or the ability to learn the technical requirements/participation in Title IV WAN.
- Effective interpersonal and managerial skills required.
- Strong commitment to customer service.
- Excellent computer skill, knowledge of software, and ability to learn new systems.
- Time management, organizational skills, and a desire to interact with students are required.
