THE INSTITUTION

The University of North Dakota (UND) is the state's oldest and largest University. Since its founding in 1883, six years before North Dakota statehood, UND has cultivated an exciting history. Unlike most state institutions of higher education west of the Mississippi, UND did not begin as an agricultural school or only as a teachers college. Instead, it was organized initially as a College of Arts & Sciences, with a Normal School for the education of teachers. Now with nearly 15,000 students and 225+ fields of study, 3,000 courses, nearly 40 online degree programs, and 84 graduate education programs; UND has more offerings than any higher education institution in the state.

State of the University and its future:

- UND has a reputation for research and scholarship in health sciences, energy and the environment, aerospace, and entrepreneurship and is known as a flagship research university.
- UND is one of the top 100 doctoral research universities in the United States.
- The \$100M Ralph Engelstad Arena is home to UND's hockey team (currently ranked among the top 10).
- UND is in the midst of unprecedented <u>construction and renovation activity</u>: \$124M medical school, \$29M renovation and addition to Wilkerson Hall dining center, \$11.5M renovation and addition to the Law School, \$18M athletics higher performance center.
- UND has an innovative strategic vision, <u>Exceptional UND</u>, which is helping to support the distinctive mission and act as a road map for UND's future.

The Dean is the chief administrator for the John D. Odegard School of Aerospace Sciences. The Dean supports the professional growth of the faculty, staff and students, encourages a collaborative ethos, and helps to facilitate overall student success and intellectual growth. As a campus leader, the Dean reports directly to the Vice President for Academic Affairs/Provost and serves on the Provost's Academic Cabinet.

The Odegard School is a world-renowned center for aerospace learning, with national acclaim for its achievements in collegiate aviation education, atmospheric and environmental research, space studies, and computer science applications. With over 700 faculty, staff and support members and approximately 2,000 students from around the world and a myriad of programs and projects, the Odegard School is composed of five academic departments and ten support divisions.

About the UND Aerospace Foundation

The UND Aerospace Foundation is a non-profit corporation created in 1985 to develop additional revenue sources to support core activities of the Odegard School. The UNDAF develops innovative business ventures with private industry that allows for flexibility, adaptability, and confidentiality that are essential for developing contracts with these outside entities.

The UNDAF operates collegiate training centers in Arizona and Minnesota, complementing the Odegard School's flight training operations in North Dakota. The UNDAF supports the mission of the Odegard School financially and through selected collaborative education and training programs. It employs over 60 full- and part-time staff.

Principal duties and responsibilities:

- Establish a vibrant vision for an internationally distinguished and contemporary School of Aerospace Sciences and effectively communicate its story.
- Support the recruitment and retention of faculty and staff to fulfill the needs and missions of the Odegard School.
- Provide academic, operational and entrepreneurial leadership.
- Encourage and support accomplishments in teaching, scholarship and research, and professional service.
- Work with the global aerospace industry, federal agencies, and other external constituents to improve education and develop projects that support economic development in the state and region.
- Create an environment of professionalism, respect, tolerance, and acceptance.
- Serve as a role model and advocate for the cultural values of the Odegard School: respect, integrity, stewardship, and excellence.
- Manage the Odegard School's staff, finances and resources effectively and efficiently, in accordance with UND policies.
- Promote effective community outreach and develop positive relationships within the local community.
- Actively participate in and support fundraising/alumni relations.
- Promote and support faculty and staff professional development in an ever-changing aerospace environment.

- Serve as the accountable executive for the Aerospace Safety Management System. In this role, the Dean has the ultimate responsibility for safety management within the organization of UND Aerospace.
- Serve as President and ex officio board member of UNDAF. In this role, the Dean works closely with the UNDAF Chief Executive Officer and Vice President of Business Development to ensure that implementation of UNDAF's flight training and other programs is supportive of and complementary to the Odegard School's operations and mission. In the event of a conflict or disagreement between the UNDAF and the Odegard School, the Dean will have the final authority to resolve any such conflict or disagreement.

- A minimum of 20 years in related relevant aerospace, industry, or university experience.
- Terminal degree in a relevant discipline.
- Academic accomplishments that would merit appointment at the professor level.
- A national reputation as an innovative leader.
- Clear commitment to the education, scholarship and research, and related missions of an
 aerospace school along with demonstrated ability to balance the specific needs and priorities
 of those missions.
- A record of successful performance as a skilled manager with the ability to grow revenues, meet budgets, measure and improve productivity and outcomes, develop people, work collaboratively and take prudent business risks to achieve goals.

Personal Characteristics:

- Strong leadership, management and consensus-building skills.
- Understanding of and commitment to the Odegard School's purpose, vision and mission.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills with the ability to communicate an inspired long-term vision in realistic terms.
- Ability to develop and motivate strong and collaborative teams.
- Self-confident with the political acumen to optimize and constructively balance the interests of a number of constituencies.
- Change-oriented mentality to promote the quest for excellence and innovation across all departments.
