# About Lewis & Clark College

Nestled among towering trees and trillium-lined creeks, **Lewis & Clark College** - one of the many wonders of Portland, Oregon - is located in the vibrant city that the New York Times calls "one of our national capitals of cool."

The Vice President is responsible for fostering the College's commitment to student success by actively developing, implementing, and maintaining programs that enrich student learning, build and maintain a strong sense of community, and promote growth through engagement in the life at Lewis & Clark College. The Vice President provides innovative vision and leadership for all student life programs and activities and leads the staff of the student life division in fulfilling its mission.

The Lewis & Clark Student Life Division empowers students to learn, lead, and engage the traditions of the liberal arts in the 21st century. As holistic educators, Student Life partners with students through their development in academic & experiential learning, civic leadership & career development, diversity & inclusion, and wellness, while creating an enduring community of belonging in which all students can take pride and realize their potential.

# Position Responsibilities:

- Provides vision, leadership, and strategic direction for the Student Life Division's programs/departments including Inclusion and Multicultural Engagement, International Students and Scholars, Campus Living, Templeton Campus Center operations, Health and Counseling Services, Student Support [Disability] Services, Health Promotion and Wellness Programs, Student Activities, The Career Center, Student Rights and Responsibilities, New Student Orientation, College Outdoors, Food Services, Student Leadership and Service, Spiritual Life, Physical Education and Athletics, and Commencement;
- Serves as a member of the President's Executive Council and is an active participant in all aspects of institution-wide strategic planning, decision-making, and policy development;
- Works with faculty in the College of Arts and Sciences to create a holistic environment that supports the success of all students;
- Is responsible for short and long-range budget planning, administration, management, and evaluation of the Division's programs, services, personnel, policies, procedures, development, and facilities in a manner congruent with the College's mission and goals;
- Administers College policies as outlined in the Student Handbook, as well as review and update policies on a regular basis in consultation with campus constituents;
- Oversees divisional assessment planning and strategies, including learning outcomes;
- Coordinates and supports student involvement and leadership opportunities, including the Associated Students of Lewis & Clark (ASLC), 100 student organizations, and student media;
- Represents undergraduate student life on a variety of College and Board of Trustee committees; works with ASLC leaders, student life, and faculty colleagues to articulate and live the values of the College community;
- Oversees the on-call response system, the Welfare Intervention Network, and collaborates with Campus Safety and others in emergency and/or crisis response;
- Serves on the leadership of the Strategic Enrollment Management (SEM) Team and administers initiatives and programs as needed to support the institution's recruitment and retention goals;
- Supports the development of student affairs professionals and staff;
- Supervises Student Affairs Administration Graduate Assistants (GA) and coordination of GA selection process for all campus positions.

## **Qualifications:**

- The successful candidate is required to have an advanced degree; earned doctorate preferred.
- At least five years of progressive leadership and administrative experience in a student-facing function.
- Experience supervising and managing people.
- Demonstrated budgetary and financial acumen.
- Understanding of and commitment to undergraduate, residential, liberal arts education.
- Demonstrated commitment to collaborative teamwork with a talented staff and engaged students, and using equity-driven leadership approaches.
- Demonstrated success in community building with an ethnically, culturally and economically diverse student body.
- Proven partnerships with faculty and academic affairs colleagues.
- Demonstrated collaborative approaches in partnering with units outside of student affairs.
- Demonstrated ability to effectively assess programs and services.
- Excellent communication skills, including effective writing and public speaking.
- Ability to exercise discretion and respond to changing priorities and crisis situations.

# Portland, Oregon

Whether you see Portland, Oregon, as a small town with a big-city feel or a big city that feels like a small town, it is a cool place to live. Art lovers can enjoy the Portland Art Museum, the Oregon Historical Society, a performing arts complex and a concert hall. For the sports-minded, the Portland area has its own NBA team (the Trail Blazers) and a major league soccer team (the Timbers) as well as minor-league baseball and hockey teams. Outdoorsy types love Forest Park, the largest city park in the nation, with 5,000 acres of hiking and biking trails, a zoo, public gardens and beautiful old-growth woods. And all of this is connected by one of the world's leading public transportation systems, a combination of buses, streetcars, and light-rail trains, making the entire metro area only a couple stops away.

If you like day trips, a short drive in any direction will lead you to some of the most breathtaking scenery in the world: mountains, seashore, river gorge and desert.

Oregon is the second most popular state to move to with 61% inbound migration. Portland is attracting both older individuals and young people with its mix of economic growth, cutting edge urban planning and scenic landscape. (Forbes)

On clear days, the Cascade Range volcanoes, Mount Hood and Mount St. Helens loom on the Portland horizon. Both snowcapped peaks are just a short drive from the city.

Stretching above 11,000 feet,
Mount Hood is Oregon's highest
point. It's a downhill and crosscountry skiers' paradise and
summer training home for the US
Olympic ski team with its yearround snow. During the spring and
summer, campers pitch their tents
on glassy mountain lakes along the
Pacific Crest Trail.

If it's ocean you're looking for, the Oregon Coast is a year-round playground for adventure-seekers and beachcombers alike. Along the scenic coast Highway 101 you'll find quaint beach towns and windwracked headlands hundreds of feet above the crashing Pacific, and miles of un-peopled beach, all of which is accessible to the public by law. Wild flowers grow atop massive cliffs, and eons of wind and angry waves have carved giant boulders into caves and lovely cathedral-esque hollows. Bring your wetsuit and surf or sea kayak among the sea lions instead of the crowds.
