

Primary Purpose

The College of Western Idaho (CWI) seeks an innovative and experienced business-minded leader with a passion for student success for the position of Provost. The Provost oversees the Deans of six schools, Extended Instruction, the Assistant Vice President of Enrollment and Student Services and the Assistant Vice President of Economic Development. The Provost works collaboratively with all divisions of the college, high schools, and local industry and businesses to meet a range of challenges. The Provost will provide leadership on such key issues as developing a distance learning strategy, promoting student outcomes assessment, enhancing a learning-centered focus in organizational structures and processes, encouraging systems thinking in solving problems, and exploring alternative instructional delivery methods to meet the varied needs of today's technologically sophisticated learners. The Provost will also provide instructional leadership in establishing objectives and plans for the development of new instructional and workforce programs/services in accordance with defined approval guidelines and budgets.

Under the direction of the President, the Provost serves as a member of the CWI's President's Cabinet and is responsible for the overall vision and direction of all instructional programs and services. The office of instruction's primary focus is to achieve affordable access and student success while demonstrating strong financial accountability in all aspects of operations. With the potential of transitioning to outcome-based funding, the Provost will aggressively address the increased financial accountability challenges by incorporating AGILE management strategies to assure the success of goals and objectives.

Essential Functions:

- Leads and directs college-wide processes for curriculum development and review; new program development, including feasibility studies to assess program need and market demand; the assessment of student learning outcomes; faculty development; and supplemental instruction.
- Finds new innovative pathways for students to move efficiently and effectively through coursework and programs
 in a more cost-effective and time sensitive manner while continuing to meet the requirements of the NWCCU,
 Idaho State Board of Education, business and industry, and Idaho State Career and Technical Education.
- Develops and maintains an outcome based operation that anticipates and responds to potential issues and implements a plan of action to address the issues.
- Critically analyzes and utilizes data related to instructional accountability and planning.
- Assesses outcomes and data as part of the annual planning cycle and resource allocation systems.
- Coordinates and supervises all aspects of the instructional, enrollment, and student services operating budget and makes recommendations for fiscal allocations to accomplish the college mission.
- Develops, implements, and maintains short- and long-term college educational master planning and strategic enrollment management processes.
- Analyzes financial and student achievement data, and prepares and/or oversees preparation of clear and concise reports as required.


- Uses data analytics to inform and update stakeholders on progress toward enrollment, retention and student success goals. Regularly conducts internal audits to test and improve all related business processes and systems.
- Uses data to make informed recommendations and decisions, monitors and tracks operations, student and programmatic outcomes, and curriculum.

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
