ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA

Established in 1885, the <u>University of Arizona (UA)</u>, the state's land-grant university, is a member of the prestigious Association of American Universities. Recognized as a global leader, and classified as a Carnegie R-1, UA conducts more than \$600 million in research and development activity each year and is currently ranked in the top 25 among all public universities surveyed. With two medical schools, UA produces graduates who are real-world ready through its <u>100%</u> <u>Engagement Initiative</u>. The UA is advancing the frontiers of interdisciplinary scholarship and entrepreneurial partnerships and benefits the state with an estimated economic impact of \$8.3 billion annually. With a total faculty of 3,144, UA currently enrolls 32,987 undergraduate students in more than 300 majors, in addition to 9,249 graduate and professional students.

Located in the city of Tucson, with a campus size of 392 acres, UA offers students a wide range of activities and academic opportunities. This includes three levels of intramural sports and more than 30 fraternities and sororities, and many other student organizations. The Arizona Wildcats NCAA Division I teams compete in the Pac-12 Conference. Classified as a highest research institution, UA involves both undergraduate and graduate students in research projects. The university has a wide range of graduate programs, including the <u>Eller College of Management</u>, the <u>James E. Rogers College of Law</u> and a <u>College of Medicine</u>.

AT UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA DIVERSITY IS IMPORTANT

At UA, students can choose from over 300 undergraduate and graduate degrees, many with an emphasis on diverse issues, including Mexican American Studies, Africana Studies, Women's Studies and more. The University of Arizona demonstrates diversity in every area with 24 % of graduates being students of color. In fact, the graduate programs demonstrate exceptional diversity as enrollment is the most diverse among all public institutions belonging to the Association of American Universities. The UA is ranked #1 in the number of PhDs awarded to Native American students and #9 in the number of PhDs awarded to Hispanic students.

THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA HEALTH SCIENCES

The <u>University of Arizona Health Sciences</u> is the statewide leader in biomedical research and health professions training. UA Health Sciences includes the College of Medicine-Tucson, College of Medicine-Phoenix, College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, and the Mel and Enid Zuckerman College of Public Health. The University of Arizona Health Sciences is a network of health-related organizations that had its beginnings on the UA campus in Tucson, more than 40 years ago. UAHS is based on the campus of The University of Arizona in Tucson while maintaining a growing presence on the Phoenix Biomedical Campus in downtown Phoenix. The UA Health Sciences reaches the greater Southwest to provide cutting-edge health education, research, patient care, and community outreach services. A major economic engine, the UA Health Sciences employs almost 4,000 people, has nearly 800 faculty members and garners more than \$140 million in research grants and contracts annually.



THE COLLEGE OF MEDICINE - TUCSON

The <u>University of Arizona College of Medicine – Tucson</u> provides state-of-the-art programs of medical education, groundbreaking research opportunities, and leading-edge patient care. Founded on the campus of the University of Arizona in 1967 as the state's only MD degree-granting college and a resource for the people of Arizona, today the UA College of Medicine ranks among the top medical schools in the nation for research and primary care. From an initial class of just 32 students, the UA College of Medicine today has graduated more than 4,000 physicians. Dedicated faculty within the <u>Department of Pediatrics</u> take care of thousands of sick children in Southern Arizona and around the state, providing general pediatric and subspecialty services. Children are cared for at <u>Banner Children's at</u> <u>Diamond Children's Medical Center</u> and at outpatient clinics throughout Tucson. Moreover, the faculty holds specialty clinics in rural areas throughout Arizona.

Finally, the faculty physician-scientists and researchers are improving children's health through the <u>UA Steele Children's</u> <u>Research Center</u>, the research arm of the department. Steele Center researchers and physician-scientists are committed to advancing medical knowledge through basic science and translational research to help improve the health of Arizona's children and children throughout the world. Training is provided to graduate students, post-docs, and fellows who are interested in pediatric medical research careers.

The <u>Department of Pediatrics</u> at the University of Arizona, in conjunction with the <u>Steele Children's Research Center</u>, seeks candidates for the **Father's Day Council Endowed Chair in Juvenile Diabetes Research** in the <u>Division of Pediatric Endocrinology</u>. This position is open to scientists with an international reputation in research scholarship and education in the field of molecular endocrinology. The ideal candidate will be a funded investigator who will lead the research program working in Type I Diabetes immunology or beta cell biology, including stem cell therapy or islet transplantation. A junior investigator with the potential to get RO1 funding will be seriously considered as well. The research environment includes state-of-the-art modular laboratories in the Steele Children's Research Center - one of fourteen centers of excellence at the University of Arizona College of Medicine. In this state-of-the-art facility, internationally known scientists and physicians research the causes of and develop cures for childhood illnesses and diseases.

In addition to government funding, the Tucson community strongly supports juvenile diabetes research and provides regular, continual funding that can be used at your discretion. The opportunity exists to greatly expand this funding.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Maintain and continue to develop an extramurally funded research program.
- Participate in the activities of the Steele Children's Research Center.
- Help promote professional development among existing faculty.
- Attract and retain highly motivated and well-qualified faculty, staff and students to the Center.
- Minimal patient care expectation for clinicians.

Qualifications

- MD, PhD, or MD/PhD.
- The ideal candidate will be a funded investigator who will lead the research program working in Type I Diabetes immunology or beta cell biology, including stem cell therapy or islet transplantation. A junior investigator with the potential to get RO1 funding will be seriously considered as well.
- Evidence of academic productivity with strong publication record.
- Ability to work with diverse students and colleagues, and experience with a variety of teaching methods and curricular perspectives.
- Demonstrated leadership of a successful and relevant research program preferred.
- National and/or international recognition in the field of Type 1 Diabetes preferred.


