# About Lewis & Clark College

Nestled among towering trees and trillium-lined creeks, **Lewis & Clark College** - one of the many wonders of Portland, Oregon - is located in the vibrant city that the New York Times calls "one of our national capitals of cool."

Lewis & Clark College is a private institution with a public conscience and a residential campus with global reach. It's a place where ideas are explored and problems are solved through interdisciplinary and global perspectives; where new knowledge is generated through collaborative faculty-student research and inquiry. The institution offers an education built from the time-tested elements of careful study, original research, and spirited debate. Lewis & Clark College serves 3,200 students in three schools - the College of Arts and Sciences, the Graduate School of Education and Counseling, and the Law School. ## The Position

Reporting to and working closely with President Wim Wiewel, the Vice President for Admissions and Financial Aid (VPAFA) will lead a strong team that is motivated, experienced, and energetic. The VPAFA is responsible for the Office of Undergraduate Admissions for the College of Arts and Sciences as well as the institutional Office of Financial Aid, which services the College of Arts and Sciences, the Graduate School of Education and Counseling, and the Law School. Serving on the President's Executive Council, the VPAFA will join a collegial, collaborative, and dedicated team of leaders.

The VPAFA is responsible for the development and implementation of innovative approaches to recruiting and enrolling first-year undergraduate domestic, transfer, and international students in collaboration with other Lewis & Clark partners, including International Students & Scholars, athletics, faculty, staff, alumni, and students. It will be important to communicate broadly the goals and successes of admissions and financial aid to engage the entire campus community. Those goals will be developed in light of Lewis & Clark's mission, financial health, and strategic plan.

The VPAFA will be tasked with meeting and exceeding undergraduate enrollment and net tuition revenue goals while balancing other institutional priorities. The VPAFA should be confident, open to change, analytical, and strategic to:

- Lead an experienced and energetic undergraduate admissions and institutional financial aid staff through transparency, support, and professional development opportunities.
- Partner closely with Public Affairs and Communications (PubCom) to enhance the College of Arts and Sciences' reputation and market position.
- Work closely to consistently update a multi-platform, multi-year marketing plan that is focused on achieving undergraduate enrollment goals and enhancing Lewis & Clark's regional, national, and international reputation.
- Manage website and social media strategy for effective undergraduate recruitment.
- Collaborate with the Chief Financial Officer to understand and support budget and revenue goals.
- Participate in admissions travel, and represent the College of Arts and Sciences at college fairs, high school visits, and interview days.
- Communicate effectively and transparently with the Board of Trustees, the President, and faculty and staff colleagues.

- Provide leadership for a financial aid philosophy and policy that supports institutional mission and priorities while supporting students.
- Enhance and make decisions regarding the enrollment management team's use of software and strategic enrollment management consulting services, including but not limited to: Slate CRM, Colleague data system, Ruffalo Noel Levitz search platform, Human Capital Research Corporation leveraging and market data, and EAB predictive analytics.
- Serve as an active member of the Strategic Enrollment Management Steering Committee. Encourage and develop
  strategic initiatives to support and enhance undergraduate enrollment efforts through both the enrollment of
  new students and the retention of continuing ones.
- Continue to strengthen relationships with key external partners, including secondary and independent counselors, Community Based Organizations, community colleges, and international counselors/agents.

The Vice President for Admissions and Financial Aid must be a seasoned professional who embraces a team environment and works collaboratively, transparently, and supportively with a dedicated and capable office. # Portland, Oregon

Whether you see Portland, Oregon, as a small town with a big-city feel or a big city that feels like a small town, it is a cool place to live. Located on the banks of the Willamette River only 90 minutes from snow-capped peaks and the Pacific Ocean, you might not realize Portland's bustling downtown and waterfront are the heart of a metropolitan region with more than 2 million people. Twelve bridges span a wide elbow of the Willamette River, connecting the east and west sides of town. Throughout the metro area are thriving neighborhoods filled with restaurants, record shops, bars, funky clothing stores, antique malls, and art galleries. Portland also has an abundance of movie theaters, new and used bookstores (including Powell's, the largest bookstore west of the Mississippi), coffee shops and clubs.

Art lovers can enjoy the Portland Art Museum, the Oregon Historical Society, a performing arts complex and a concert hall. For the sports-minded, the Portland area has its own NBA team (the Trail Blazers) and a major league soccer team (the Timbers) as well an American professional women's soccer team (the Thorns), and minor-league baseball and hockey teams. Outdoorsy types love Forest Park, the largest city park in the nation, with 5,000 acres of hiking and biking trails, a zoo, public gardens, and beautiful old-growth woods. And all of this is connected by one of the world's leading public transportation systems, a combination of buses, streetcars, and light-rail trains, making the entire metro area only a couple stops away.

If you like day trips, a short drive in any direction will lead you to some of the most breathtaking scenery in the world: mountains, seashore, river gorge, and desert.

Oregon is the second most popular state to move to with 61% inbound migration. Portland is attracting both older individuals and young people with its mix of economic growth, cutting edge urban planning and scenic landscape. (Forbes)

On clear days, the Cascade Range volcanoes, Mount Hood and Mount St. Helens loom on the Portland horizon. Both snowcapped peaks are just a short drive from the city.

Stretching above 11,000 feet,
Mount Hood is Oregon's highest
point. It's a downhill and crosscountry skiers' paradise and
summer training home for the US
Olympic ski team with its yearround snow. During the spring and
summer, campers pitch their tents
on glassy mountain lakes along the
Pacific Crest Trail.

If it's ocean you're looking for, the Oregon Coast is a year-round playground for adventure-seekers and beachcombers alike. Along the scenic coast Highway 101 you'll find quaint beach towns and windwracked headlands hundreds of feet above the crashing Pacific, and miles of un-peopled beach, all of which is accessible to the public by law. Wild flowers grow atop massive cliffs, and eons of wind and angry waves have carved giant boulders into caves and lovely cathedral-esque hollows. Bring your wetsuit and surf or sea kayak among the sea lions instead of the crowds.
