ABOUT STATE COLLEGE OF FLORIDA

Established in 1957, State College of Florida (SCF) is an integral part of the community and a vital resource for students and their families in Manatee, Sarasota, and surrounding counties. SCF is the region's first and largest public college, serving 11,000 college credit students annually at campuses in Bradenton, Lakewood Ranch, Venice, and via online classes. Another 14,000 participants annually attend professional development and personal enrichment classes.

Formerly known as Manatee Junior College/Manatee Community College, SCF has expanded its mission to include



workforce baccalaureate degrees while continuing to focus on highly respected associate degrees that prepare graduates for university transfer and professional careers. SCF offers a complete college experience that includes athletics, more than 40 student clubs and organizations, honors programs, and student-centered academics. SCF's flagship programs in health sciences are supported by state-of-the-art technology including patient simulators, electronic medical records, drug recognition system, and medication-dispensing devices.

Consistent with the mission to provide quality learning to people of all ages through noncredit continuing education, community services and some credit-related activities, SCF's Corporate and Community Development Division offers year-round noncredit classes in workforce training, small business development, professional development, personal enrichment and driving safety through workshops, seminars, online classes, and on-site training programs at area businesses.

Broadening the continuum of education, State College of Florida Collegiate School (SCFCS) opened in the fall of 2010. This tuition-free, sixth- through twelfth-grade public charter school is an innovative model influenced by the Swedish international school, which nurtures motivation and independence, ensuring student success while guiding students toward higher education. Every year since its opening, the SCFCS has been graded an "A" school by the Florida Department of Education and the program has been recognized by US News & World Report with a bronze ranking for Best High Schools. SCFCS provides students with the opportunity to graduate simultaneously with a high school diploma and associate college degree. An additional campus, SCFCS-Venice is currently recruiting juniors for the fall of 2020 and will ultimately serve as a full 9th – 12th high school.

State College of Florida is accredited by the <u>Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges</u> to award associate and baccalaureate degrees. The College is a member of the Association of Florida Colleges, the American Association of Community Colleges and the Florida Association of Colleges and Universities.

THE DIVISION OF NURSING AND HEALTH PROFESSIONS

The Division of Nursing and Health Professions at State College of Florida includes the following programs:

Nursing:

The program for the **Associate in Science in Nursing (ASN)** combines course work on campus with guided clinical experiences in health care agencies in both Manatee and Sarasota counties. There are two methods for completion of the program, the <u>basic approach for students</u> who have no previous nursing course work, and the <u>transition approach</u> for the Licensed Practical Nurse. Graduate Success on Licensure (NCLEX-RN) Exams exceed Florida and national averages and for the last three academic years, <u>98-100% of students reported they were employed in nursing positions within 12 months of licensure</u>. SCF's **Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N.)** program was developed in response to requests from local hospitals and healthcare providers. The program started in January 2010, on both the Bradenton and Venice campuses, and provides current registered nurses (RN) with the opportunity to obtain a B.S.N. To provide additional access to education for working RN's, approval to offer the RN-BSN program in an online format was secured and coursework began in the 2011-12 academic year – this program has been <u>ranked #1 of its kind</u> in the state of Florida. <u>Program outcomes</u> associated with the BSN are also very strong, including 100% of employers reporting satisfaction with the program for the last three years.

The Medical Technology & Simulation Center at SCF Lakewood Ranch opened for Fall 2010 classes. The two-story, 42,000 sq. ft. building houses nursing, other health professions, education, and SCF's new Energy Technology Management Program. Important features in this building include the nursing skills lab, nursing assessment lab, and Intensive Care Unit lab with state-of-the-art technology including patient simulators, electronic medical records, drug recognition system, and medication-dispensing devices.

SCF's nursing programs, Baccalaureate and Associate degree level, are approved by the Florida Board of Nursing and accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, 3343 Peachtree Road NE, Suite 850, Atlanta, Georgia 30326. Dental Hygiene:

The **Dental Hygiene** program prepares students for employment as a dental hygiene educator and clinician in a variety of settings including private dental practice, public health departments, institutional and research facilities, and public and private schools. SCF's Dental Hygiene Clinic is equipped with 13 state-of-the-art dental units for a high-quality educational experience as well as patient comfort and care. Graduates of the Dental Hygiene program will be awarded an associate in science degree and will be eligible to take the *National Board Examination* and the *Florida State Licensing Examination* which are both required for licensure in the state of Florida. For the past five years, 100% of SCF graduates have passed the National Board Dental Hygiene Exam and 100% of graduates that actively sought employment found work in the field. SCF's Dental Hygiene program is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association, 211 East Chicago Ave., Chicago, IL 60611-2678, 312-440-2500. Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA):

The **OTA** program prepares graduates to function as members of the health care team. The OTA is able to work in a variety of practice areas including, but not limited to, pediatrics, physical disabilities, and mental health. The program combines coursework at SCF with selected clinical experiences in Manatee and Sarasota counties. The OTA program is a two-year Associate in Science degree program accredited by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) of the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA), located at 4720 Montgomery Lane, Suite 200, Bethesda, Maryland 20814-3449. Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA):

The **PTA** program at SCF trains skilled health care providers to work under the supervision of a licensed physical therapist. PTA's will work in a variety of settings including acute and rehabilitation hospitals, private physical therapy offices, community health centers, outpatient and sports facilities, corporate or industrial health centers, research institutions, extended care facilities, home health agencies, pediatric centers, schools, colleges, and universities. Data obtained via graduate surveys indicates that for the past three academic years, 100% of students who sought employment in this field were employed as PTAs within one year of graduation. The Physical Therapist Assistant Program at SCF is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE), 1111 North Fairfax Street, Alexandria, Virginia 22314. Radiography:

SCF's **Radiography** program combines didactic and clinical education to prepare the graduate for a career as a radiographer. During the program, students are rotated through several different health care facilities. Upon completion of the program, the graduate is eligible to take the American Registry of Radiologic Technologist Exam to become a registered radiographer. For the past five years, 100% of SCF graduates have passed the National Certification Examination and 100% of graduates that actively sought employment found work in the field. SCF's Radiography program is accredited by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology, 20 N. Wacker Drive, Suite 2850, Chicago, IL 60606-3182. Additional Health Professions Program Partnerships:

Additionally, SCF has partnered with St. Petersburg College (SPC) to offer a collaborative training program for **Respiratory Therapists**. In this collaborative program, students may take their general education courses at any SCF campus. If enrollment in this program is sufficient, students will complete their clinical training at hospitals in the Manatee and Sarasota areas.







THE OPPORTUNITY

The Dean of Nursing and Health Professions reports to the Executive Vice President and Provost and is responsible for the administration and supervision of degree programs within the division. The Dean is responsible for overseeing the development, implementation, and maintenance of courses, programs, and curricula within his/her leadership area.

Essential Duties/Responsibilities:

- Provides leadership and guidance for the development and management of the nursing and health professions programs.
- Demonstrates commitment to the institutional strategic priorities; adheres to and promotes College Rules and Procedures which in turn reflect updated federal, state, and local legislation that governs the educational process.
- Supervises the recruitment, selection, hiring, orientation, and retention of a diverse faculty and staff; certifies faculty credentials in accordance with college policy; collaborates with human resources for salary determinations and submits appropriate personnel recommendations to the Executive Vice President and Provost.
- Supervises and evaluates academic, professional, and career employees as assigned.
- Oversees the development and implementation of class offerings and schedules for the nursing and health professions programs and assures that students meet clinical experience.
- Monitors program changes required by state mandates or local and national trends and oversees preparation of specialized program accreditation, application, and self-study.
- Assists with the preparation of brochures, catalogs, and other marketing materials pertaining to the nursing and health professions programs.
- Serves as a liaison to ensure consistency in program offerings covering all instructional sites.
- Prepares and administers budgets for the nursing and health professions programs.
- Serves on, or chairs, various college committees and represents the college on various state and community committees and organizations as appointed and deemed necessary for the continual operation of the program and college functions, and attends advisory committee meetings.
- Provides intermediary services to faculty, students, and staff during formal and informal grievance processes.
- Verifies faculty teaching loads and payroll authorization of instructors.
- Oversees admission process for students.
- Provides research and documentation to the Executive Vice President and Provost to help in the resolution of formal grievances.
- Performs other similar and related duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- A master's degree in Nursing or one of the health professions offered by the college from an accredited institution of higher education is required; a doctoral degree is preferred.
- At least five (5) years successful teaching and/or administrative experience in higher education.
- At least five (5) years of clinical (or clinical teaching) experience.
- More than five (5) years of direct supervisory experience including responsibility for hiring, firing, performance management, training, and coaching is required.
- A current, valid license in Nursing or one of the health professions offered by the college.
