ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA

Established in 1885, the <u>University of Arizona (UArizona)</u>, the state's land-grant university, is a member of the prestigious Association of American Universities. fraternities and sororities, and many other student organizations. The Arizona Wildcats NCAA Division I teams compete in the Pac-12 Conference. Classified as a highest research institution, UArizona involves both undergraduate and graduate students in research projects. The University has a wide range of graduate programs, including the Eller College of Management, the James E. Rogers College of Law and a College of Medicine.

The landscape architecture program includes a fully accredited graduate MLA degree program and a newly formed BLA program. The School of Landscape Architecture and Urban Planning is seeking applicants for a faculty position at the intersection of landscape architecture and urban design. The ideal individual is one who can teach both undergraduate and graduate design studios at all levels. This is a full-time faculty position at the rank of pre-tenure assistant professor or tenured associate professor, commensurate with experience. The position will ideally begin August 2021. The successful candidate will have a demonstrated interest in design theory, collaborative design methods, and urban placemaking. This individual will identify with the artistic side of landscape architecture and be fluent in contemporary urban design approaches that integrate form-making with socio-cultural factors and landscape ecology. UArizona is especially interested in candidates who focus on underserved and marginalized communities, and who can enrich its faculty diversity.

Duties and Responsibilities

The successful candidate will be prepared to expand CAPLA's interdisciplinary partnerships and work collaboratively within the College, University, and external networks in ways that contribute to CAPLA's strategic goal of Building a Changing World. The School is looking for an innovator who can develop transformative strategies and future-oriented theories and perspectives on sustainable design, climate mitigation, and urban green infrastructure within the context of interdisciplinary practice, artistic approaches, social equity, and heritage conservation.

The successful candidate will align their professional direction with the University's Strategic Priorities through:

Engagement:

Engage students in advanced regional and international outreach and research in best practices in sustainable urban design. Contribute to the development of international programs including Micro Campuses, study abroad programs, and online courses and programs. Strengthen ties to and potential student recruitment from underrepresented communities. Develop community outreach opportunities and interdisciplinary urban design studios.

Innovation:

Advance research in professional practice, landscape urbanism, urban revitalization, green infrastructure, site planning, master planning, and adaptive reuse of urban and industrial sites. Create synergies between public agencies and private industry toward built environment technological innovations and design solutions to address grand challenges.

Partnership:

Advance CAPLA's engagement strategies with local, regional, and global partnerships. Create independent and team-taught design studios at all levels with expertise in data-driven research, predicting change, visioning future built environments, urban infrastructure design, collaborative processes, design thinking, and design innovation at the landscape, neighborhood, and site-specific scales. Advance interdisciplinary teaching and practice.

Synergy:

Strengthen collaboration across CAPLA and UArizona programs in accordance with College and University Strategic Plans including initiatives with the Institute for Place and Wellbeing, Institute of the Environment, the UArizona Office of Sustainability. The collaborative units will include: College of Fine Arts, College of Social and Behavioral Sciences, College of Engineering, Institute of the Environment, College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, College of Humanities, and College of Education.

QUALIFICATIONS

Minimum

- Master's degree in Landscape Architecture or related field AND at least one professional degree in Landscape Architecture (undergraduate or graduate) from an accredited program.
- Specialization in best practices in urban design with experience in landscape ecology, socio-cultural factors in design, and applied art in landscape architecture.
- Working knowledge of the major digital media software.
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills.

Preferred

- Strong background in design theory, urban design, and landscape architectural practice.
- Previous teaching experience, in particular, collaborative interdisciplinary teaching or practice.
- Experience working with diverse and underrepresented communities.
- Experience in regional and international outreach.
- A record of peer-reviewed scholarly/creative research (e.g., publications, competitions, awards) and attracting extramural funding.
- Professional licensure, or qualifications to become licensed.
- Doctoral degree in Landscape Architecture or a related field.
