UNIVERSITY POINTS OF PRIDE

- RWU is the only university in the state to have an ABA accredited School of Law.
- RWU offers a state-of-the-art Marine and Natural Sciences building which is home to an aquatic animal
 diagnostic lab and the state's only shellfish hatchery. The proximity to the ocean supports the popular Marine
 Biology program which allows students to explore the aquatic world through lectures, labs, fieldwork, and
 independent research.
- RWU boasts innovative international partnerships in the Dominican Republic that span multiple disciplines. Our
 partnership with Grupo Puntacana, a global leader in sustainable development and eco-tourism, provides
 student summer paid internships in business, hospitality, engineering, marine biology and architecture, and is
 a growing partnership that will continue to support more students across a range of disciplines. RWU is also
 partnering with BARNA Management School on a student-exchange initiative to have RWU students study at
 BARNA and to bring business students from the Dominican Republic to study at the Gabelli School of
 Business.
- Every student is provided the opportunity to participate in a real-world learning experience that helps a community partner locally or globally, through courses and research opportunities. At the School of Law, students provide our local communities with pro bono legal services, gaining real-world experience while serving real needs within our communities and many complete more than 100 hours of service before graduation.
- Our Sailing program is home of the No. 2 collegiate champs in the nation. For two years in a row, RWU Sailing has captured second place in the Inter-Collegiate Sailing Association National Championship team race event.

Leadership



In 2019 <u>Ioannis Miaoulis</u> (pronounced YAH-nis Me-OW-lis) was appointed the 11th President of Roger Williams University. Prior to his appointment at RWU, President Miaoulis served as the President and Director of the Museum of Science in Boston and as the Assistant Provost and Dean of the School of Engineering at Tufts University. He has led large-scale efforts to spark passion for innovation and Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) education among young learners around the world.

In his first three years at the university, President Miaoulis has helped lead transformations at the university in leadership, philanthropy and planning. While navigating the impact of the pandemic, RWU was able to launch its Excellence by Design strategic plan framework (below) and transform the culture of philanthropy for the university. RWU has increased annual giving by 60% since President Miaoulis joined the university

Recently, RWU secured its largest ever gift to the university: a \$20 million investment in our School of Architecture and emerging real estate programming, resulting in the naming/dedication of the Cummings School of Architecture and launch of the Cummings Institute for Real Estate.



Margaret Everett has served as the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs since 2020. She is the strategic leader across RWU's six schools of study and University College collaborating with faculty and staff on the design of new academic models and programs that enhance the university's mission to strengthen society through engaged teaching and learning. Previously she has served as Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Lesley University and as Dean of Graduate Students and Vice Provost for International Affairs at Portland State University.

Dr. Everett holds a PhD and M.Phil in anthropology from Yale University and a Bachelor of Arts in Latin American Studies from Smith College. She has published extensively in the areas of public health and urbanization in Latin America through an anthropological and sociological lens.

Degree programs offered include Criminal Justice, Cybersecurity & Networking, Forensic Science, Leadership, Legal Studies and Public Administration. The faculty, students and advisors in the School of Justice Studies are committed to academic and professional excellence. Members of the School of Justice Studies are committed to excellence in teaching to prepare students for leadership positions in the U.S. justice system. Maintaining positive relationships, developed over time, with justice system agencies will ensure students gain a variety of professional experiences as an essential part of the educational experience.

SCHOOL OF JUSTICE STUDIES HIGHLIGHTS

- For more than two decades, the Justice System Training and Research Institute (JSTRI) has provided
 professional development programming and applied research toward evidence-based solutions to justice
 system professionals. These programs include a command series for police, victim advocacy, conflict
 resolution/mental health aid, and other educational programs directed at contemporary criminal justice
 issues.
- Under a generous grant from the Hassenfeld Family Initiative, RWU Legal Studies/Psychology Departments
 and the Rhode Island Family Court engaged in a community based interdisciplinary project to develop a coparenting video of best practices for parents going through the divorce process. The project included work
 from Rhode Island judges, university professors, RI court administrators, mental health professionals and
 RWU undergraduate and law students. For more information click here.
- Forensic science students have the unique opportunity of being fully immersed in processing crime scenes through a one-of-a-kind, <u>virtual-reality crime-scene training program</u> designed for undergraduate students. This VR program allows users to safely process crime scenes and use a blood spatter simulator to conduct bloodstain pattern analysis (BPA).

Under the direction of the Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs, the Dean, School of Justice Studies is the principal academic of the School of Justice Studies and advances the mission of the university, contributes both academic and administrative leadership, and provides the first level of review for matters within the School. The Dean will provide and manage effective support mechanisms for faculty and students and assist in the development and implementation of the School's long-range strategic plan and diversity initiatives. The Dean provides leadership and management for the School in the areas of the quality and content of the curriculum, successful student outcomes, budgeting, faculty and staff recruitment and development.

Essential Functions/Characteristics

Administration


- Provide leadership for and oversee the development, coordination, organization, scheduling and supervision of
 instructional programs in the School, and promote interdisciplinary collaboration with programs in other academic
 units of the university.
- Oversee the development of curriculum initiatives with faculty and shepherd those initiatives through the appropriate approval process.
- Allocate resources to the programs within the School, including faculty, support staff, budgets, and space.
- Articulate the goals of the School.
- Develop, maintain, and manage budgets according to the timeline of the university, reviewing proposed budgets, and making recommendations to the Provost and Senior Vice President. Plan, develop, and manage the School's day-to-day operations.
- Support faculty in teaching, scholarship and grant writing.
- Provide leadership in hiring, retaining, mentoring, managing, and evaluating faculty and non-faculty staff.
- Ensure the School's compliance with all program and institutional accreditation standards and external regulatory and accreditation standards/bodies where applicable.
- Proactively pursue and participate in fundraising and grant proposals either personally or through faculty and/or staff members of the School.
- Participate in admissions activities, including orientation sessions, open houses, admissions days and other programs for prospective students.
- Develop and expand collaborative and interdisciplinary relationships and programs with other schools across the university.

Additional Functions

- Participate in faculty and university committee activities.
- Teach up to one course each semester in discipline as assigned.
- Respect and maintain confidentiality, parameters of operation, professional protocols, and individual privacy.
- Perform other administrative/instructional duties assigned by supervisor or supervisor's designee.

Required Qualifications

- Terminal degree in a field of study relevant to the programs within the School of Justice Studies.
- A record of successful teaching and scholarship.
- Experience with program leadership and faculty development.
- Ability to relate to and work with students in various aspects of their academic pursuits.
- Good interpersonal, management and conflict resolution skills.
- Ability to establish organizational priorities and make difficult choices among competing demands.
- Ability to foster continuous and open communication for faculty, non-faculty, and students.

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






BRISTOL & PROVIDENCE, RHODE ISLAND
