<u>Salt Lake Community College</u> (SLCC) has come a long way since its founding as a small technical college 76 years ago. SLCC now serves tens of thousands of students at eight (8) SLCC locations and online throughout Salt Lake County.

As an emerging Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI), SLCC leads the state with the highest enrollment of students from the Latinx/a/o community which represents a commitment and affirmation of its dedication to becoming a model for inclusive and transformative education.

SLCC serves its students by offering programs with highly transferable credits and at affordable cost. Flexibility, choice, and job relevance are hallmarks of the SLCC educational experience. Highly qualified and engaged faculty, assisted by academic and career advisors, provide the academic support that students need.

LEADERSHIP FOR SLCC'S FUTURE

SLCC is a comprehensive community college that includes a distinct technical college. It works as an educational collaborator, with a unique mission to be a bridge between high schools and Utah's four-year and research universities. The College also links students and their training to the needs of the community's employers. SLCC is constantly evolving to meet the changing needs of students and the community.



The Vice President will be joining SLCC at a pivotal time, partnering with the College's new President, Provost, and other Cabinet members. **Dr. Greg Peterson** was selected to lead Utah's largest two-year higher education institution in April 2024. Throughout Dr. Peterson's tenure in higher education, he has demonstrated his commitment to the community college mission of providing all students with access to and success in higher education and in life.

A first-generation community college student himself, Dr. Peterson has launched many initiatives focused on student learning and success. He led college promise programs at several two-year institutions and pioneered the nation's first associate degree programs in artificial intelligence and machine learning. Dr. Peterson has a strong track record of establishing partnerships with community and industry leaders to strengthen workforce pipelines, enabling students to translate their education into family-sustaining careers. Additionally, Dr. Peterson has led efforts to improve the rate of community college student transfer to four-year and research universities. In 2024, the U.S. Department of Education

recognized his work in this area. Most notably, at one institution Dr. Peterson oversaw a 45% increase in transfers for Native American students, a 39% increase for Black students, and a 13% increase for Latinx students.

President Peterson is active in several national education organizations. He serves on the governing board of the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU) and the Excelencia in Education's Presidents for Latino Student Success. He also currently volunteers his time to the American Association of Community College's Commission on Institutional Infrastructure and Transformation and previously served on its Commission on Economic and Workforce Development.

Before taking the helm at SLCC, Dr. Peterson was the President of Chandler-Gilbert Community College in Arizona. He holds a doctorate in educational administration with an emphasis in community college leadership from the University of Texas at Austin; a master's degree in postsecondary, adult, and continuing education from Portland State University; and a bachelor's degree in English from Brigham Young University.

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

Salt Lake Community College is Utah's largest two-year college with 50,000 students, proudly educating the state's most diverse student body in eight areas of study at eight locations and online. Almost half of its students are first in their family to attend college, and over 24% are from Hispanic/Latinx communities. As it works toward becoming a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI), SLCC deepens its commitment to inclusive and transformative education.

ABOUT SALT LAKE TECHNICAL COLLEGE

Salt Lake Technical College (SLTech) is one of three Technical Colleges within the State of Utah that falls under the auspices of a degree-granting institution. Many of the programs and credentials offered by SLTech are co-mingled with SLCC to allow for maximalizing resources for robust offerings. Examples include offerings from the School of Professional & Technical Specialties, conferring Applied Associate of Science (AAS) degrees from pathways in SLTech, not-for-credit offerings, and "custom fit" programs that are employer-driven offerings. The Division of Health Care Technologies, which includes programs such as nursing assistant, medical assistant, and pharmacy technician is housed within the School of Health Sciences at SLCC. SLTech presently serves more than 1,100 students annually.

Unlike community colleges that offer a broader range of academic programs, SLTech specifically targets workforce development and technical skill-building, preparing students for careers in high-demand industries with a focus on providing practical, hands-on training and education in a variety of trades and technical fields. It is an excellent option for individuals looking to enter a specific trade or technical field quickly and affordably. Its focus on hands-on training, practical skills, and strong ties to local industries makes it a valuable resource for students aiming to enter the workforce with in-demand skills.

SLTech offers a wide variety of career-focused programs. Some of the areas of study include:



ABOUT THE POSITION

The Vice President of Salt Lake Technical College (VP of SLTech) will serve on SLCC's Executive Cabinet and report to the Provost of SLCC. Direct reports for the VP of SLTech include a Dean, Administrative Assistant, a Marketing Manager, an Associate Dean of SLTech Student Support, a Sr. Director of Instructional Operations, and an Assistant Vice President of Workforce Training. Thus, a successful candidate for this role will have strong familiarity with wrap-around services to student recruitment, retention, and success.

The incoming VP of SLTech will help refine systems and processes for cultivating the optimal technical program portfolio. Emphasis will be on assessing labor data and fostering curriculum for high demand, high yield jobs. The VP of SLTech and their team will focus on building a reputation of shepherding programs that result in overall high levels of satisfaction with impressive completion rates, high job placement, and strong licensure pass rates, when applicable.

Program expansion requires reallocating existing or procuring new sources of revenue. A successful candidate for the VP of SLTech will demonstrate potential to secure external funds and to prioritize existing funds. The VP of SLTech will be the outward facing professional interacting with workforce partners in Salt Lake County, other technical colleges, and Utah State Higher Education (USHE) workforce-focused colleagues.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provides leadership for the Salt Lake Technical College's Instruction and Student Success, oversees budget
 approvals, annual program modifications, new program development, strategic enrollment planning, and student
 access initiatives within a large, integrated matrixed model.
- Develops and implements strategic plans for instructional innovation and student success, ensuring alignment with industry trends, accreditation requirements, and best practices for student support in coordination between technical and academic programs.
- Advocates for student success, technical education, and program accountability, collaborating with local education
 agencies and service area communities to drive student recruitment, retention, completion, and post-completion
 outcomes including job placement and licensure.
- Supervises and supports Associate Vice Presidents, Directors, faculty, and staff across the College and drives continuous improvement.
- Ensures compliance with state and federal regulations, including Title IX, civil rights, accreditation requirements,
- Leads all areas within the College by cultivating a culture of collaboration and respect and works across campuses to enhance student experiences and operational efficiency.
- Establishes, evaluates, and maintains public and private sector partnerships (e.g., industry partnerships, Job Corps, Department of Corrections, Division of Juvenile Justice, and Youth Services, etc.) and career and technical education (CTE), to support instructional programs and funding initiatives.

- Monitors student enrollment trends, admissions, and satisfaction metrics, implementing improvements where necessary.
- In partnership with the Provost and the Vice President of Student Affairs, leads the College's involvement in state and national conversations on higher education, student affairs, and related topics.
- Assumes responsibilities in the absence of the Provost and manages performance evaluations, grievances, and staff development processes.
- Collaborates with Executive Cabinet and stakeholders to advance the mission of the College.
- Provides reports and support to the President, Provost, and Vice President for Student Affairs in meeting their responsibilities.
- Represents the College in Executive Cabinet, Board of Trustees, community boards, state councils, and internal committees.
- Facilitates a positive, respectful, and inclusive working environment.
- Continuously develops leadership, staying current through professional reading, training, and external engagement.
